"Our work finds its inspiration by experiencing the different aspects of the human condition. Digging into the unspeakable, the in-betweens, the grays, and the intersections. We reflect on identity as a constant state of tension, always in a state of change and construction. We explore the complexities in our emotions and contradictions through a sensual, poetic, eclectic and humorous manner."

The Choreographic duo is integrated by Moonsuk Choi and Yamila Khodr, born and raised in South Korea and Argentina respectively. In 2018 they founded the company 12H Dance, based in Berlin. *12 hours* is the time difference between their native lands. Both countries are on opposite sides of the globe, in the junctions and differences appear the beauty and sensibility of their creation.

They create dance theater productions and installations, often in collaboration with artists from different fields. They co-produced internationally with German and Korean institutions.

Hyldra Collective Contemporary Circus and Dance

Hyldra Collective is a Berlin-based contemporary circus and dance company, combining circus with dance and physical theatre, founded in 2018 by Naomi Bratthammer and Emma Laule. In 2020 Sophia Kurmann joined the company as a producer. *When we started wanting* is a search for female empowerment, exploring how to overcome gender-stereotypes and asking what an empowered female physicality looks like. *Fandado* depicts an inner struggle between the pressures of an efficiency-obsessed society and the longing for kindness and care.

The performers have developed a shared physical language. By combining the circus medium vertical rope with flying low, contact dance, and partner acrobatics, they manipulate each other through the rope, which acts as a third partner rather than a tool. Using the centrifugal forces when spinning, the rope becomes an image for the connection between the performers, as it transmits movement between them, but also visualizes tension and mutual dependency. They have played at various international venues such as the WIP of the Berlin Circus Festival and the Cotilleando Festival on Fuerte Ventura.

Jasmine Ellis is a Munich-based Canadian. A choreographer and film director. Her distinct voice weaves together familiarity, vulnerability, and humor. Gripping audiences with worlds that simultaneously engage and challenge. Her substantial body of critically acclaimed work uses the entire human expression: movement, language, music, media.

Recent works include *Empathy* (2018), remounted at the Rodeo Festival (Munich); *back and until* (2018) as resident choreographer for Springboard Danse Montreal (Canada); the short film *Lockdown* (2020) created in collaboration with LajaMartin – Physical Dance Theater Company (USA); and *everything blue* (2020) created with Evandro Pedroni (Vienna/Brazil). The trilogy *Lucas is lonely* (2019) commissioned by Winnipeg's Contemporary Dancers (Canada), *Toni is lonely* (2019) as part of DANCE Festival and in cooperation with Residenztheater, as well as the stage-project turned film *Is Susan lonely*? (2020). In 2021 Ellis created a variety of new award-winning films. In September 2021 *skin hunger* premiered at HochX in Munich. New creations for 2023 & 2024 are already in the works.

Jonas Frey explores the potential of urban dance in the context of contemporary choreography. His artistic work is focused on the deconstruction of urban dance forms, especially breaking.

The choreographic work begins with motifs, whose meaning is derived from the interplay of space, dancers, and audience. From there, constellations develop that focus on human encounters in a joint process of creation by collaborating artists. Inspired by those interactions, associations to philosophical and societal topics are shared with an audience. Many of Jonas Frey's projects are developed for flexible stage situations outside the theater, often accompanied by mediating formats that are also accessible to diverse target groups off-stage.

Jonas Frey completed the master's program in choreography COMMA at Codarts and Fonty's in the Netherlands. He receives top funding from the state of Baden-Württemberg and realizes a trilogy on the theme of urban dance in the context of contemporary choreography over the next three years.

The Berlin-based Italian choreographer Luana Rossetti creates independent, socio-political dance theatre. Her work has received funding from the City of Berlin, Saxony, Italy, Denmark and Fonds DaKu. She has been awarded prizes for choreography.

Luana is expanding her interest to participatory and collaborative performances. She calls for intersectional feminism and dance activism aiming for psycho-social evolvement. Through thought-provoking performances of oneiric and dark dance theatre she focuses on collective memory and on understanding our social systems.

Miller de Nobili was co-founded by choreographers Maria Chiara de' Nobili and Alexander Miller. Both completed the M.A. Choreography at Palucca University for Dance Dresden in 2020. Miller de Nobili was born from the idea of finding a shared form for their common interests in urban and contemporary dance, physical theatre, and breaking. Their first work *Momento* won the Scapino Ballet Production Award at the 2021 Choreography 35 Competition and was invited to the Dance Days Chania and the Istanbul Fringe Festival 2021.

PACK, co-produced with TANZPAKT Dresden premiered in September 2021 at Hellerau and was later presented at the Tanzplattform Deutschland 2022. Their latest work *clouds for tomorrow* premiered at PACT Zollverein in the frame of the Atelier No 66 in April 2022. This year, they will produce new works for Big 5 SILK Fluegge (Austria) and Renegade/Pottporus e.V., for Staatsballett Hannover, and a new co-production with Hellerau.

Miller de Nobili follows on from the individual success of both choreographers: the choreographies for La Biennale di Venezia (de' Nobili); the founding of the breaking crew THE SAXONZ (Miller), three times qualified for the Breaking World Championships; and many years of collaboration with Hellerau.



Markus Wörl founded his agency woerlpool in Munich at the beginning of 2021, with which he produces and organises tours for international theatre and nouveau cirque productions throughout Germany and Europe. After more than 30 years of professional experience in international festival and production management, he has a large worldwide network and knows many of the internationally important festivals and venues through many years of collaboration.

As climate protection manager Markus is intensively involved with the topic of sustainability in culture. He sits on the expert council for the EU programme "Greening the Creative Europe Program 2021 - 2027" and was honoured by the French Minister of Culture as Chevalier des Arts et du Lettre.

Markus Wörl has been able to bring in some highly renowned dance and nouveau cirque companies and represents the following ensembles for tours in Germany and Europe.

The works of the Pepe Arts Collective focus on the individual in relation to their environment.

"In the beginning, there was space – in the beginning, there was nothing, in the beginning, there is everything." With the elements of acrobatics and dance, the piece tells tales of loving care and social commitment, of greed, and the struggle to survive. The artists take us to the endless expansion of space and to microscopic spheres. A contemporary circus performance with elements of dance and theatre.

The resulting hybrid aesthetic is to go on tour with simple means. We have lean, technical, and scenically optimal equipment, which allows us to transport performers, material, and technology in just one vehicle. By integrating the digital content into the overall analog concept, a bulky stage set was avoided, and a rousing stage world was conjured up with the help of modern technology.

Critical spaces (2022), 55 min.

Critical Spaces takes us on a journey of perception of spaces. The piece not just focuses on architecture but on social interrelations as well. The artists take us to the endless expansion of the space and to microscopic spheres. A contemporary circus performance with elements of dance and theatre.

Yoriko Maeno is a Japanese choreographer for contemporary dance theater in Berlin. For her time-critical pieces, she investigates stories of people in our society and the history of culture at the edge of social standardization. She explores combining opposites like majority and minority, present and past, and reality and fantasy. With film sequences from original locations and digital art, she sets documentary material against moving digital worlds. In the center acts the moving human. Her style draws from contemporary dance as well as Japanese Butoh.

Yoriko Maeno studied choreography at Ochanomizu University in Tokyo and Career College of UdK, Berlin. Since 2018 she works in Berlin. Her projects receive funding from the district, state, and federal government in Germany. In 2020 she became a member of the Conseil International de la Danse (CID) of UNESCO.

Her two current productions tell of aging but beautiful and endearing women. In 2020 AMA-Perlentaucherin was created for a 360°film version and VR glasses. Live Premiere will be in November in Berlin. In *HIROs LIED*, the great Butoh dancer Yumiko Yoshioka (69) gives a Japanese immigrant with Dementia. Next Show in December, at Sudhaus in Tübingen.
